#### New Member & Renewal Application

The club has released a new membership application for new members and renewals. The two important changes are; the addition of the required "Trust ID," and the elimination of 72 MHz frequency channels. Be aware that you'll need to take the TRUST test and acquire your Trust ID to renew and/or join the club as a new member in the future.

Please note that it is only necessary for us to have your initial TrustID certification on file to join or renew. You need not send your TrustID card in to us every year when you renew.

The Trust test is a very simple multiple-choice test based on common sense. Once you complete the test, you receive an online Trust ID certificate with certification number. This is the number you'll need to include on your renewal application. Just print it out and send it along with your application.

For two months we've tried to arrange a date and time to dedicate the bench in Bob's memory, but COVID has still upended things this year and coordination with the membership and Bob's family has not been possible.

# Training Update



Pilot Training is not only a great way to introduce people to the hobby, but also a great way to bring new members into the club.

Historically we've had instructors sit at the field on Monday nights hoping to see a new candidate show up curious about RC. Those days have come and gone. People have just too much packed into their day and we as instructors are no different. That's why I've been an advocate of appointment training, and it seems to be working out well.

Today we have social media, texting, our website, and, the good old telephone to set and keep appointments with new students. Our participation in the AMA Introductory Pilot (IP) program helps us to set goals with new students and establish a timeline for graduating to pilot status. To become certified, stu-

dents must fly their own aircraft, using their own equipment without the use of stabilization technologies, proving they have the competence to fly safely.

To date this year, we have

ten new members that have joined the club either directly or indirectly as a result of our training activities. These were individuals that made training requests through our website or showed up at the field to inquire about learning to fly. In the wings we have five other students trying to acquire the skills to become pilots. We believe that most all of them will become pilots and members as well.

Ed Malec and Steve Tarney and I have tried to make the most of the IP Program and we believe that it has paid off, especially during this year of COVID.

We're looking for two more instructors to take on mentoring students for 2022. We assign students based on their interest in electric versus nitro, and the brand of radio they prefer. This makes it easy to match up an

instructor with a student, and it makes the buddy box connections easier to manage because of familiarity with the equipment.

If you are interested in mentoring a new student next year, please let me know. I can arrange to provide you with the trainer aircraft be it nitro or electric and the buddy box equipment. What's nice about our program is that it's by appointment only, this means that there are no missed training sessions as long as you stay in close communication with your student.
